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About this manual

This manual explains how to install, activate, configure, and use HireRemote by Cybality v0.2.2 on Windows. It also documents the one-time free trial, worldwide job discovery, the in-app application browser, Assisted Auto Apply, Resume Studio, Interview Prep, Application Tracker, security features, and common troubleshooting steps.

Screenshot note

HireRemote screenshots in this manual are rendered from the v0.2.2 interface included with the supplied source/build package. Windows installation and security dialogs are representative examples; wording and button placement can vary by Windows version, SmartScreen reputation, Smart App Control, antivirus software, and organization policy.

System requirements

Operating system	64-bit Windows 10 or Windows 11.
Processor	x64-compatible processor.
Web runtime	Microsoft Edge WebView2 Runtime must be available on the target computer.
Internet	Required for first license activation, periodic Gumroad membership verification, job updates, and online research. Some local features continue without Internet.
.NET	The released app is published self-contained; end users do not need to install the .NET 8 runtime separately.
Installer	HireRemote-by-Cybality-0.2.2-x64.msi
Membership	\$9.99 per month through Gumroad. A one-time 10-minute free trial is also available to an eligible Windows user.

Important security principle

Do not disable Windows security globally

If SmartScreen warns about the current unsigned installer, use the per-file More info / Run anyway flow only when you intentionally downloaded HireRemote from a trusted Cybality source. Do not turn off Microsoft Defender SmartScreen, Smart App Control, or organization-wide security controls just to install the app.



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1. Install HireRemote on Windows

The v0.2.2 MSI installs HireRemote under the 64-bit Program Files area, creates a desktop shortcut, and creates a Start Menu shortcut. The published application itself is self-contained.

Step 1 - Locate the MSI

- 1 Download or copy the HireRemote MSI to the Windows computer where you want to use the application.
- 2 Open File Explorer and browse to the folder containing HireRemote-by-Cybality-0.2.2-x64.msi.
- 3 Confirm that the filename matches the version you intended to install. If the installer came from an unexpected email, file-sharing site, or unknown sender, do not run it until you verify the source.
- 4 Double-click the MSI to start installation.

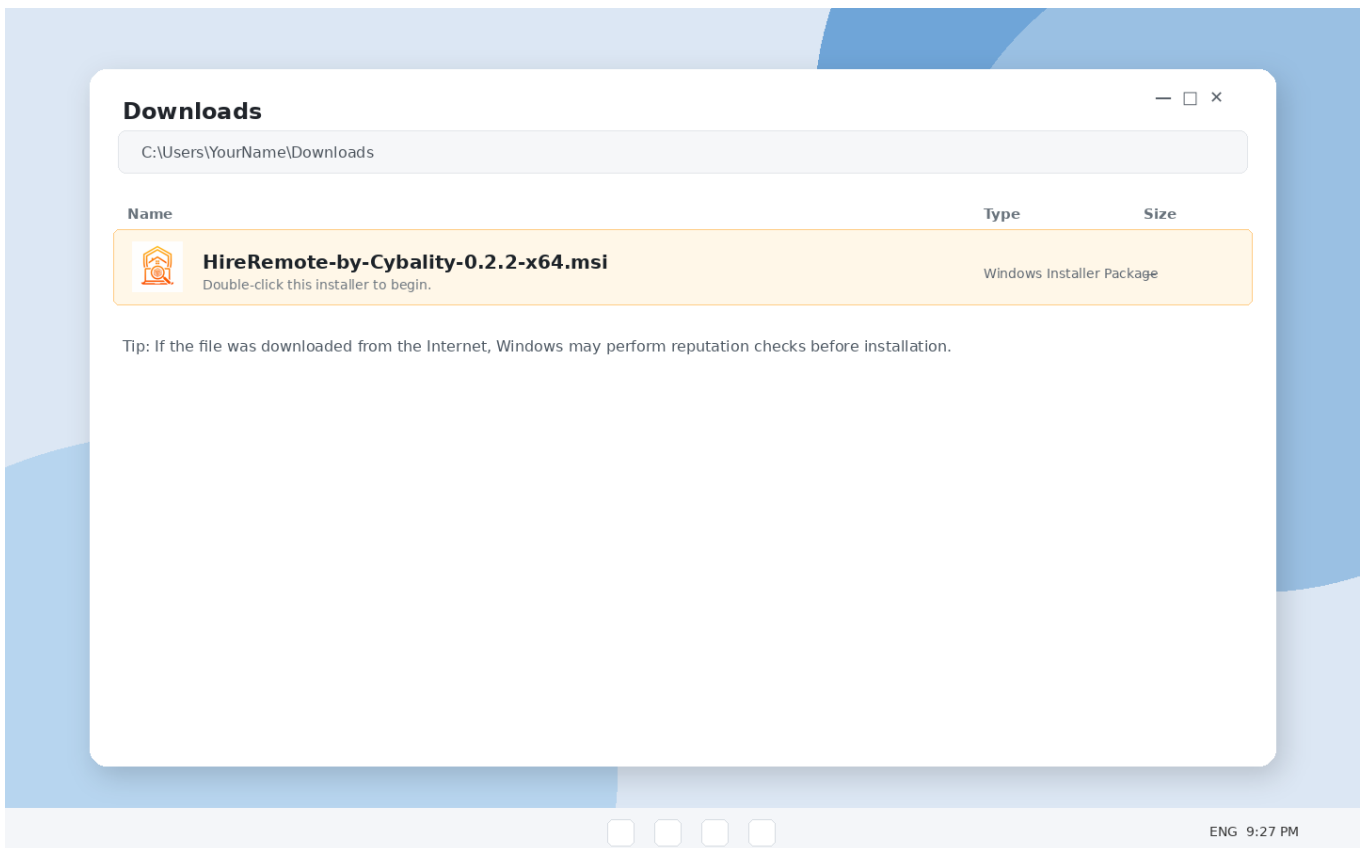


Figure 1. Example: locating the HireRemote v0.2.2 MSI in Downloads.

Why the installer may be challenged by Windows

A new or unsigned installer can have little or no SmartScreen reputation. That does not by itself prove the file is malicious, but it means Windows is asking you to make an informed trust decision.

Step 2 - If Windows opens the installer immediately

Some systems will go directly to User Account Control or Windows Installer. If you do not see SmartScreen, continue to the User Account Control instructions in the next section.

2. SmartScreen and User Account Control

2.1 Common SmartScreen warning

Microsoft Defender SmartScreen checks downloaded applications and files for known malicious content and reputation. On a new or unsigned HireRemote build, Windows may display a blue Windows protected your PC message.

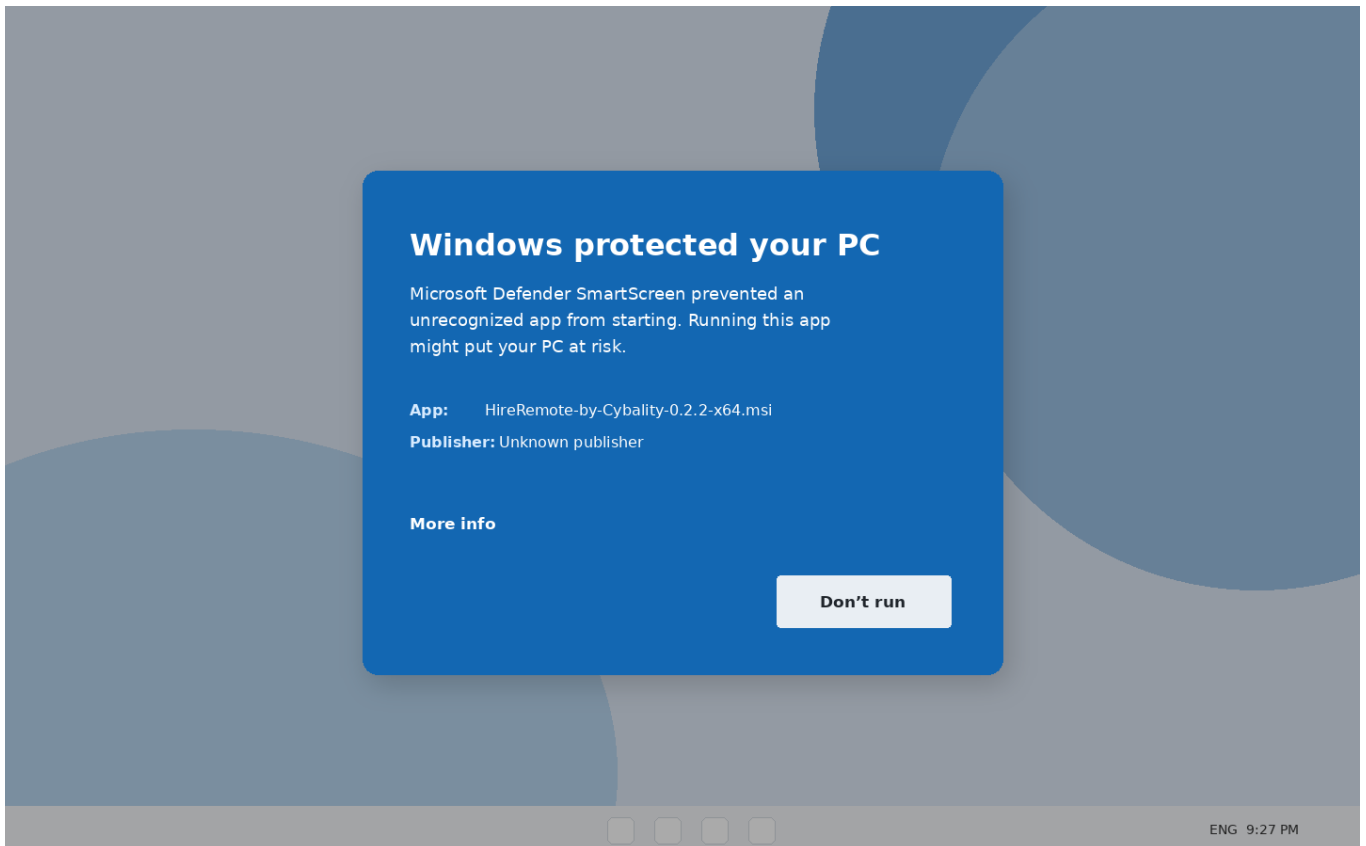


Figure 2. Representative SmartScreen warning for the HireRemote MSI.

2.2 Proceed only when you trust the installer

- 1 Read the warning and confirm the App field refers to the HireRemote MSI you intended to run.
- 2 Click More info. Windows may then reveal the publisher information and an additional Run anyway button.
- 3 If you obtained the installer from a trusted Cybality source and you intentionally want to install it, click Run anyway.
- 4 If the filename or source is not what you expected, choose Don't run and obtain a clean copy from Cybality.

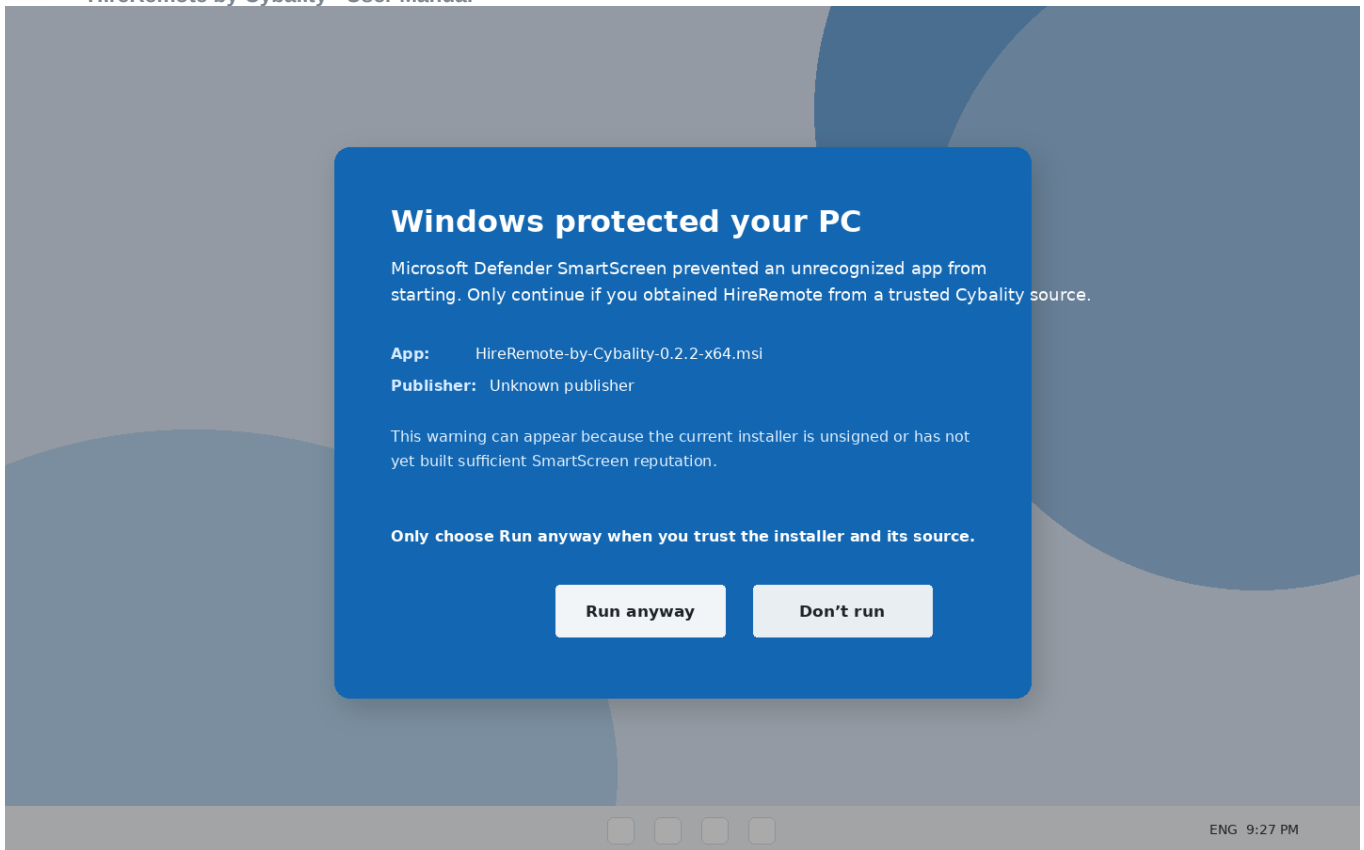


Figure 3. Representative expanded SmartScreen prompt with Run anyway.

If Run anyway is missing

On a business-managed PC, Smart App Control, Windows Defender Application Control, AppLocker, antivirus software, or organizational policy may block unsigned installers without offering an override. Do not disable those controls. Contact the device administrator or use a properly code-signed HireRemote build.



2.3 User Account Control (UAC)

After SmartScreen, Windows may ask whether the installer can make changes to the device. This is the normal elevation step required to install files under Program Files.

- 1 Confirm the app is HireRemote by Cybality and that you started the installation yourself.
- 2 Because the current build may be unsigned, Windows can show Unknown publisher.
- 3 Select Yes to continue. If you did not start this installation, select No.

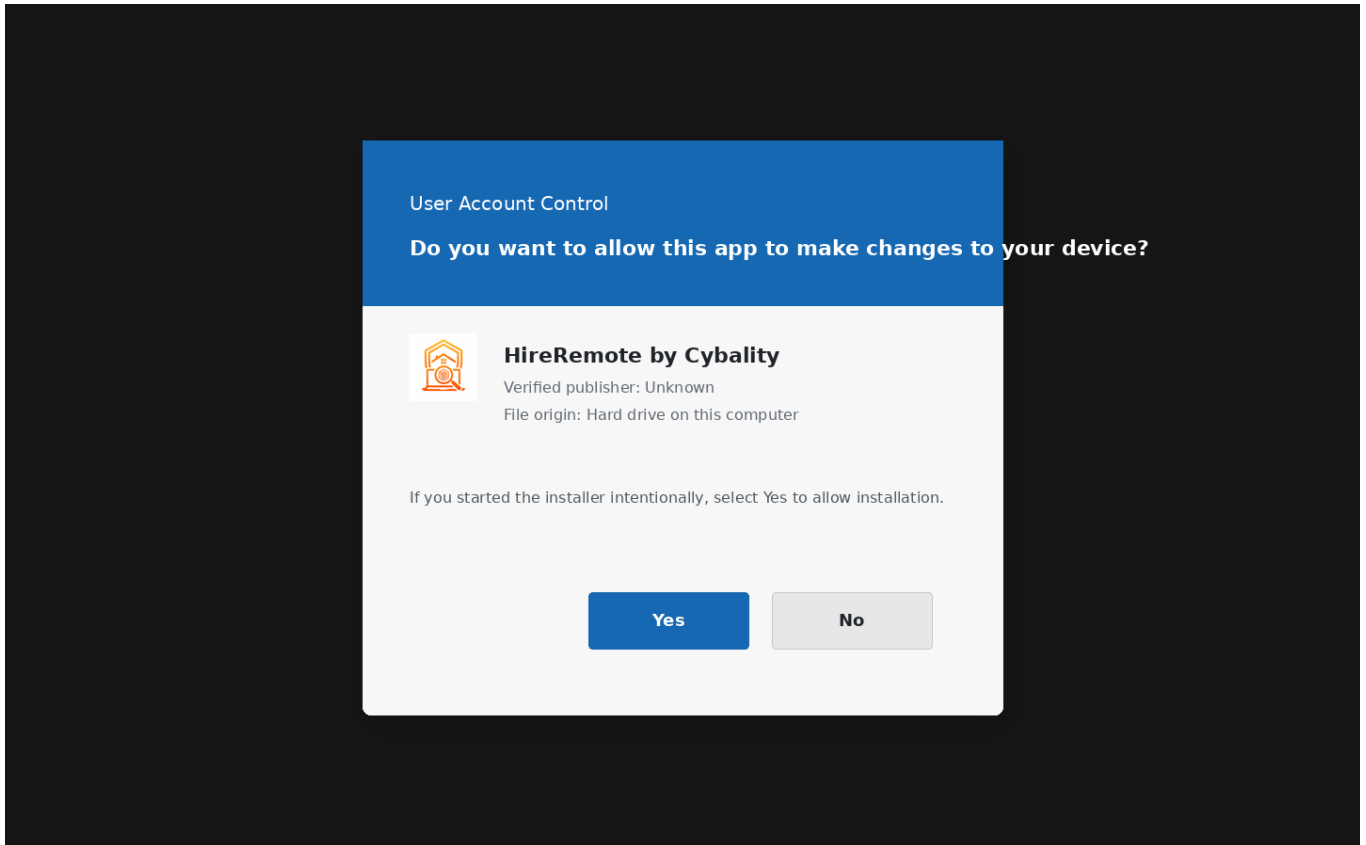


Figure 4. Representative User Account Control prompt.

2.4 Installation progress

Windows Installer copies the published HireRemote executable to the Cybality application folder and creates desktop and Start Menu shortcuts. Installation may complete quickly, depending on the computer.

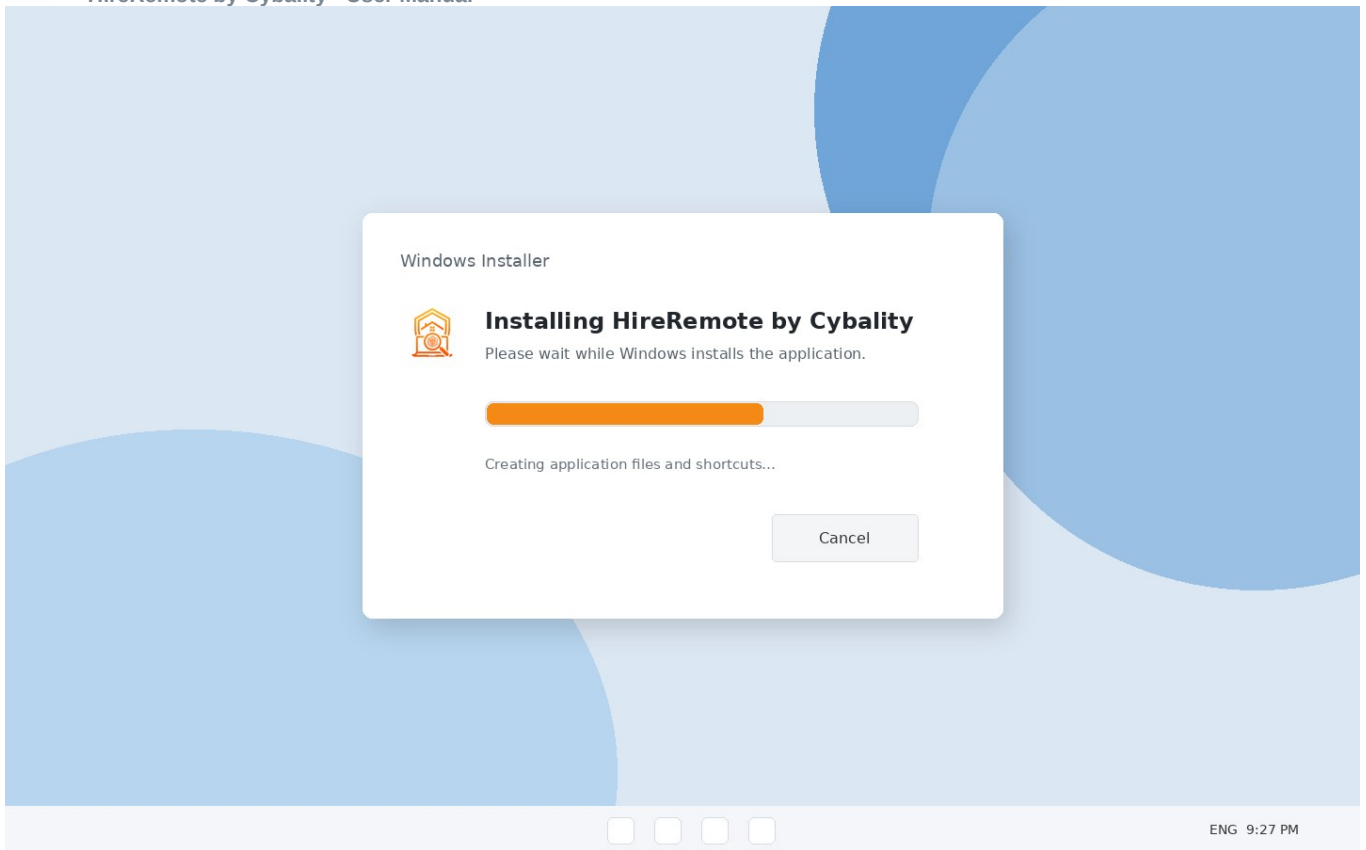


Figure 5. Representative Windows Installer progress screen.

2.5 Launch HireRemote

- 1 When installation finishes, return to the desktop or open the Start Menu.
- 2 Double-click HireRemote by Cybality.
- 3 The first launch opens the membership / free-trial screen.

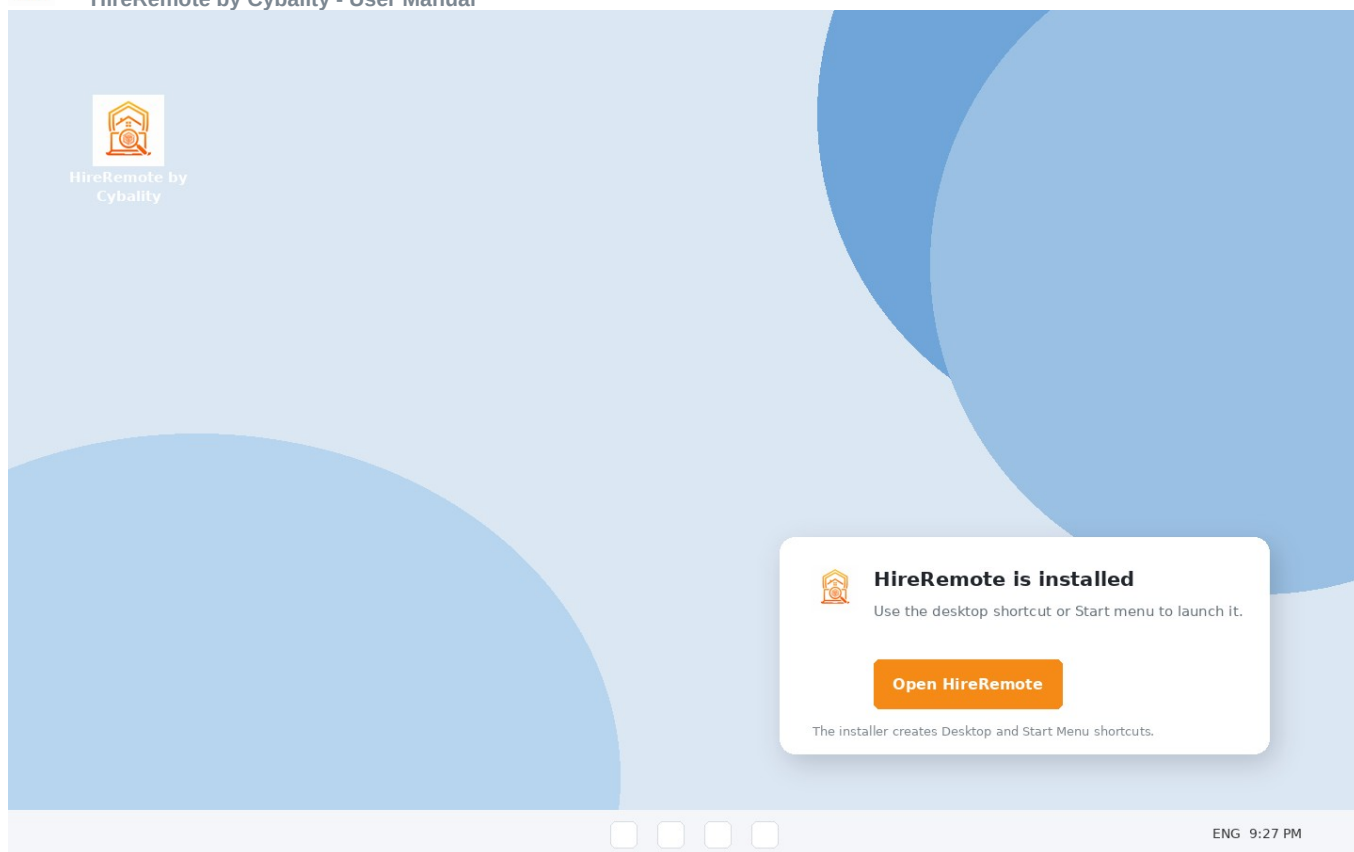


Figure 6. Example desktop shortcut after installation.

3. First launch, membership activation, and the free trial

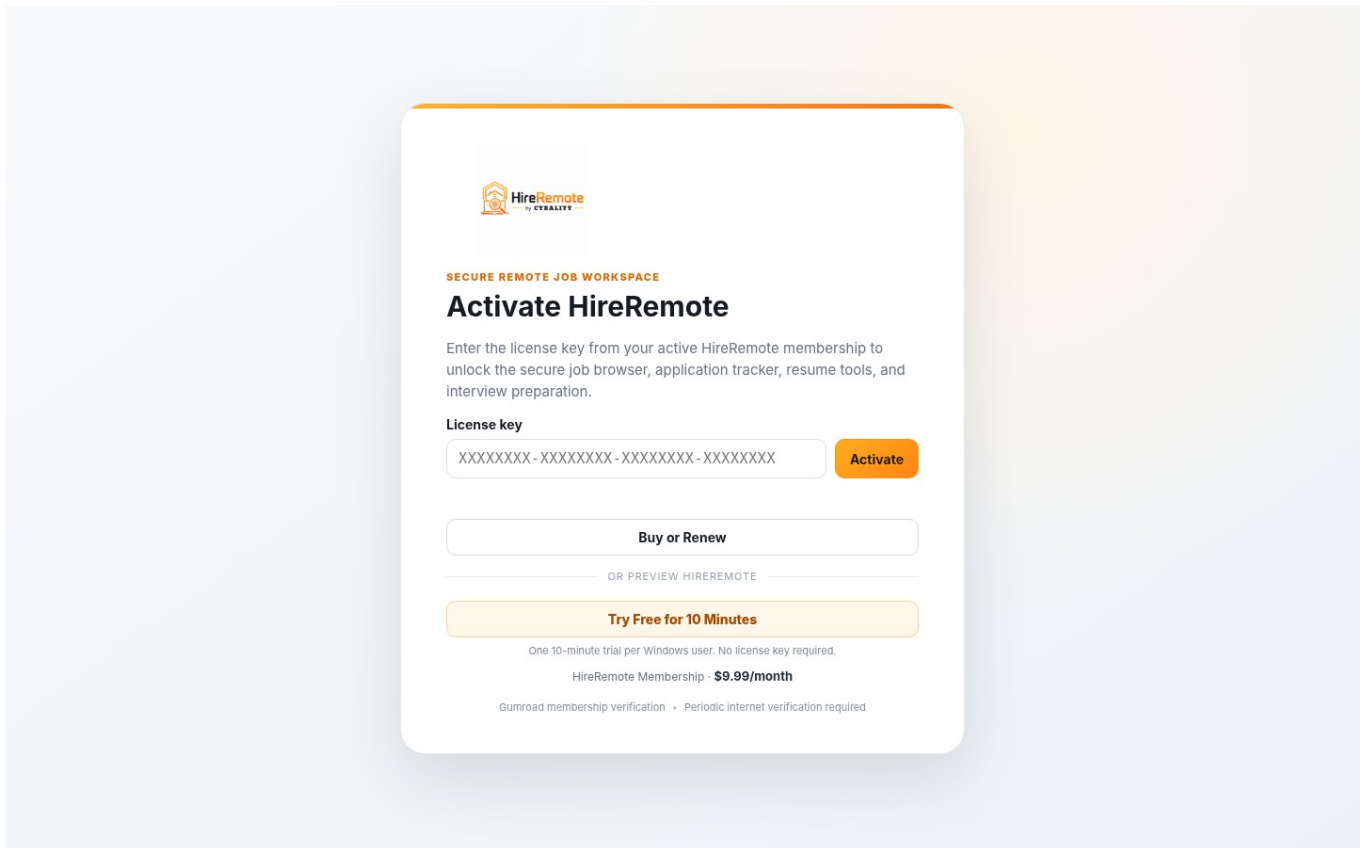


Figure 7. HireRemote activation, purchase/renewal, and one-time free-trial screen.

3.1 Activate an existing membership

- 1 Make sure the computer has Internet access for the first verification.
- 2 Paste the Gumroad license key associated with the active HireRemote membership into License key.
- 3 Click Activate.
- 4 HireRemote sends the product identifier and license key to Gumroad for verification. Routine checks do not intentionally increment Gumroad's license-use count.
- 5 After successful verification, HireRemote stores the validated license locally using Windows user-scoped DPAPI protection and opens the job-update screen.

3.2 Buy or renew

Click Buy or Renew to open the official HireRemote Gumroad product page inside HireRemote. The product page is <https://cybality.gumroad.com//HRCYB> and the membership price shown in v0.2.2 is \$9.99/month. After purchasing or renewing, close the purchase browser, enter the license key, and click Activate.



3.3 One-time 10-minute free trial

- 1 If the Windows user is eligible, click Try Free for 10 Minutes.
- 2 The timer begins immediately. Closing and reopening HireRemote does not reset the timer; the remaining time continues from the original start time.
- 3 A countdown appears in the main HireRemote interface while the trial is active.
- 4 At 00:00, HireRemote closes any open application browser and returns to the license screen.
- 5 After the trial is consumed, that Windows user is not offered another 10-minute trial through a normal reinstall. A successful paid activation also consumes any unused local trial entitlement.

Trial purchase-flow fix in v0.2.2

When a trial has ended and the user chooses Buy or Renew, HireRemote forces a fresh navigation to the official Gumroad product page instead of returning to the last job application that was open.

3.4 Periodic membership checks

- HireRemote normally re-verifies a cached membership after about 24 hours.
- After a recent successful verification, an offline grace period of up to 72 hours can allow continued access if Gumroad is temporarily unreachable.
- After the grace period expires, Internet verification is required again.
- Refunded, disputed, chargebacked, failed, cancelled, or ended memberships are rejected when Gumroad reports those conditions.

4. Automatic job update screen

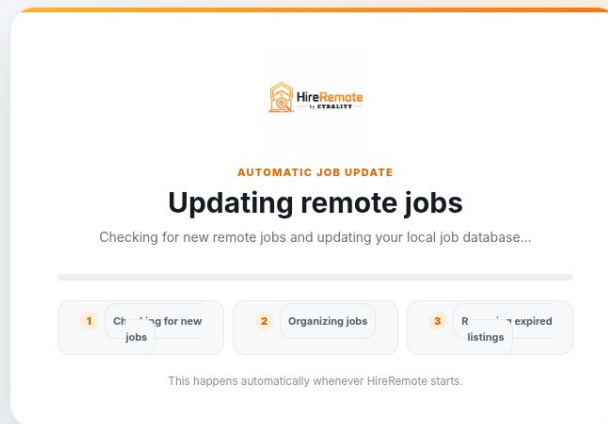


Figure 8. Startup job-update screen. Provider/source names are intentionally hidden here.

After activation or trial entry, HireRemote performs a startup job check before showing the main workspace. The screen intentionally uses generic progress labels rather than listing individual job providers.

What happens during startup

- 1 Checking for new jobs - HireRemote polls supported public feeds/APIs when each source is eligible for refresh.
- 2 Organizing jobs - imported records are normalized, deduplicated by URL, categorized, assigned security metadata, and written to the local SQLite database.
- 3 Removing expired listings - jobs outside the 90-day retention window are removed. Application Tracker records are stored separately, so your application history can remain after an old job listing expires.
- 4 Opening HireRemote - the main workspace loads after the sync completes or, if a source is temporarily unavailable, after HireRemote falls back to the jobs already stored locally.

No manual refresh button

Job collection is automatic. Users choose the schedule in Settings: Hourly, Every 6 hours, Every 12 hours, or Daily. Daily is the default, and HireRemote also checks when the app starts.

5. Home dashboard

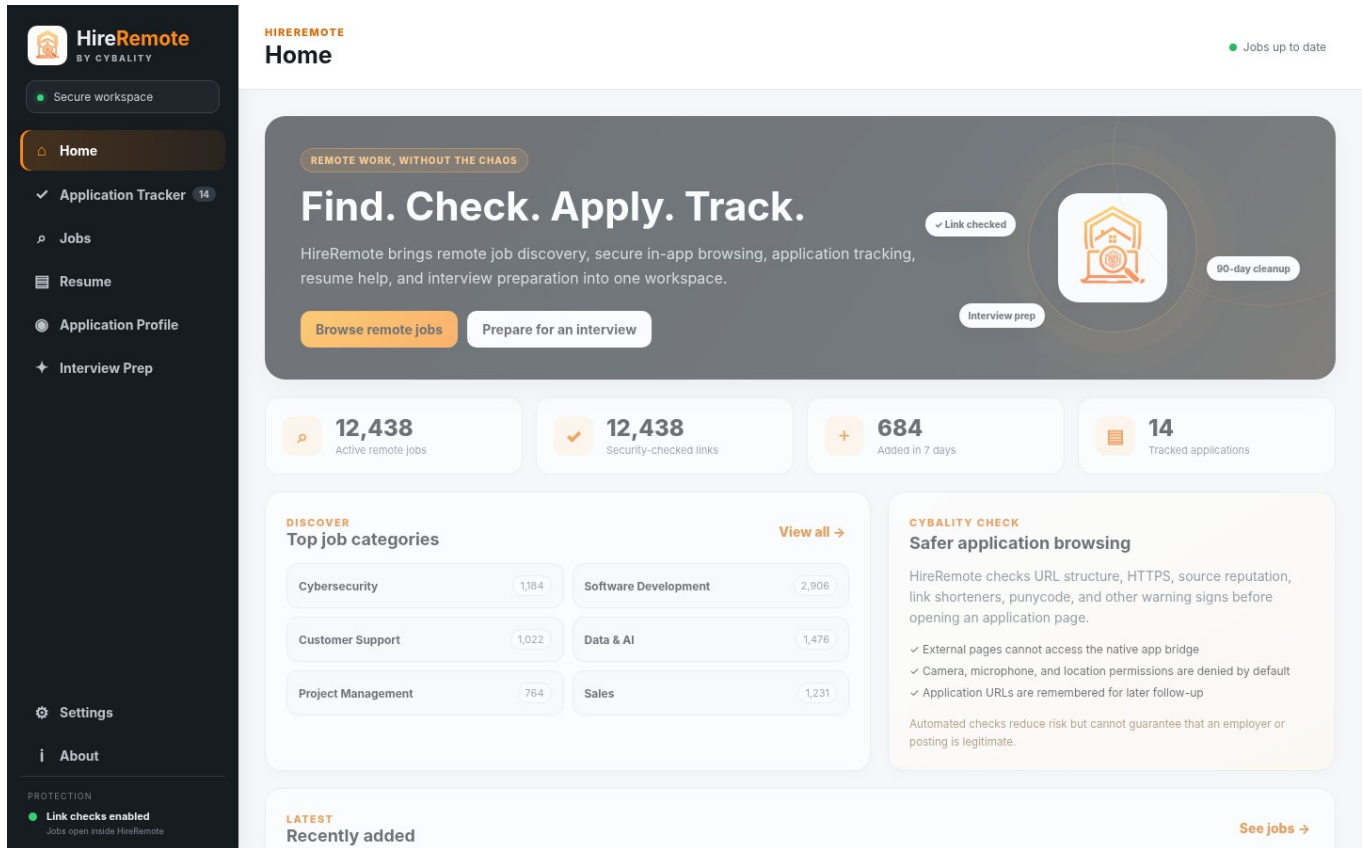


Figure 9. Home dashboard with persistent side navigation.

Dashboard areas

- Active remote jobs - number of currently visible jobs after location filtering.
- Security-checked links - jobs that have received HireRemote link/source risk analysis.
- Added in 7 days - recent additions to the local job database.
- Tracked applications - total items in Application Tracker.
- Top job categories - shortcuts into the Jobs page.
- Recently added - quick access to newer listings.
- Safer application browsing - summary of HireRemote's browser-isolation and permission restrictions.

Persistent side navigation

The left side menu remains available across the normal app pages and also remains visible while an employer or ATS site is open in the application browser. Current sections are Home, Application Tracker, Jobs, Resume, Application Profile, Interview Prep, Settings, and About.

6. Jobs: search, categories, and location filtering

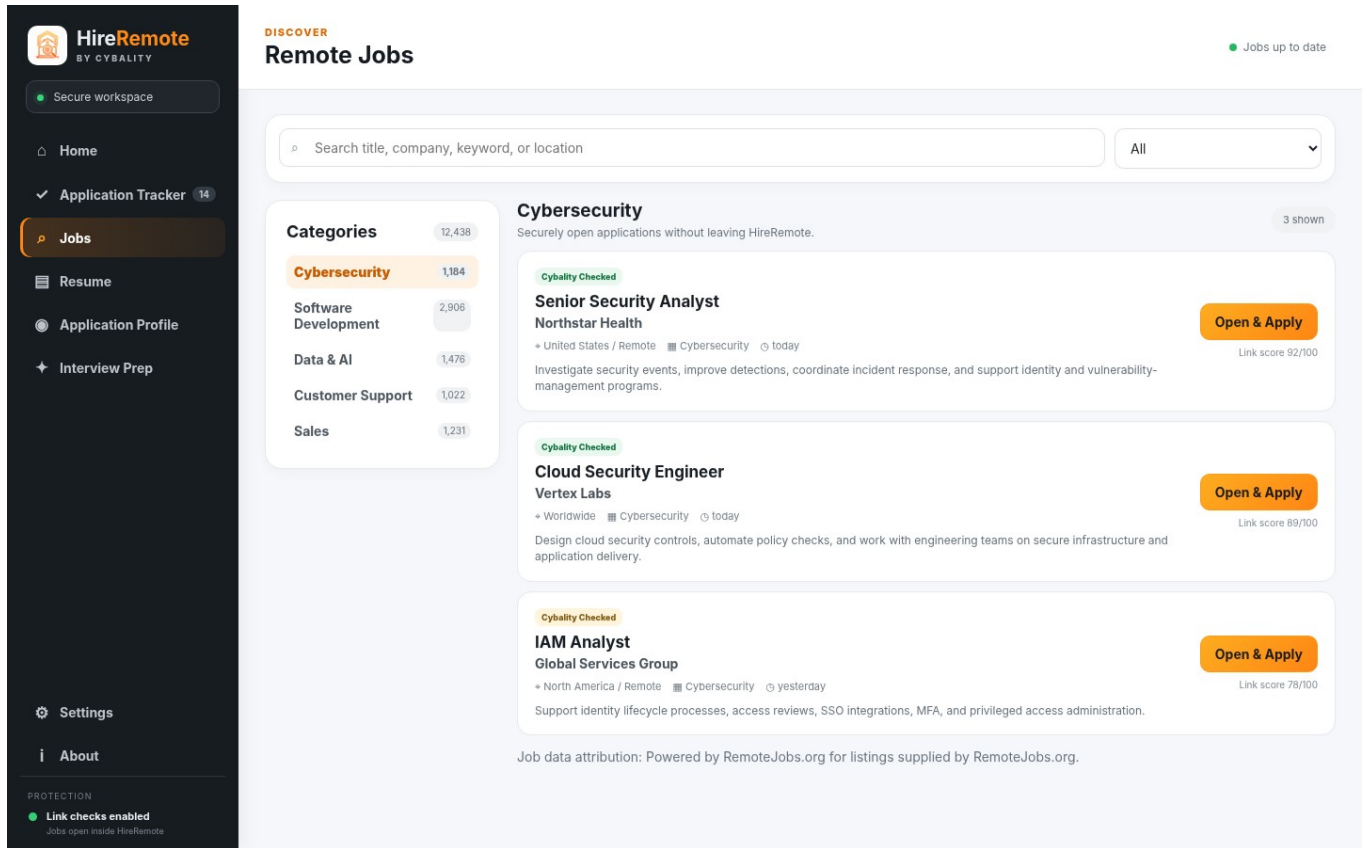


Figure 10. Jobs page. The upstream provider badge is not shown beside Cybality Checked.

Search and filter jobs

- 1 Open Jobs from the side navigation.
- 2 Use the search box to filter by title, company, keyword, or location within the local database.
- 3 Choose a category from the left-side category list or the category drop-down.
- 4 Review the title, company, stated location/eligibility, category, age, description, Cybality Checked label, and link score.
- 5 Click Open & Apply to review the destination and open the employer/ATS page inside HireRemote.

Location behavior

Worldwide is the default. Settings can change the visible job scope to United States only or My home country only. Home-country mode uses a type-ahead country list and includes roles explicitly marked worldwide plus roles whose stated eligibility covers the selected country or a broader region that includes it. Postings with unknown geographic eligibility are excluded from country-only mode rather than being assumed eligible.



Current v0.2.2 job-source adapters

The v0.2.2 build includes public/documented integrations for Himalayas, Jobicy, Arbeitnow Europe, Arbeitnow UK, We Work Remotely, Remotive, Remote OK, and RemoteJobs.org. Source/provider information is retained internally and required attribution can appear in general attribution areas, but the provider badge is hidden next to the Cybality Checked label on individual job cards.

Important

HireRemote does not literally guarantee that every employer or posting is legitimate. Source collection and Cybality Checked are risk-reduction tools, not an identity-verification service.

7. Cybality Checked and link-review warnings

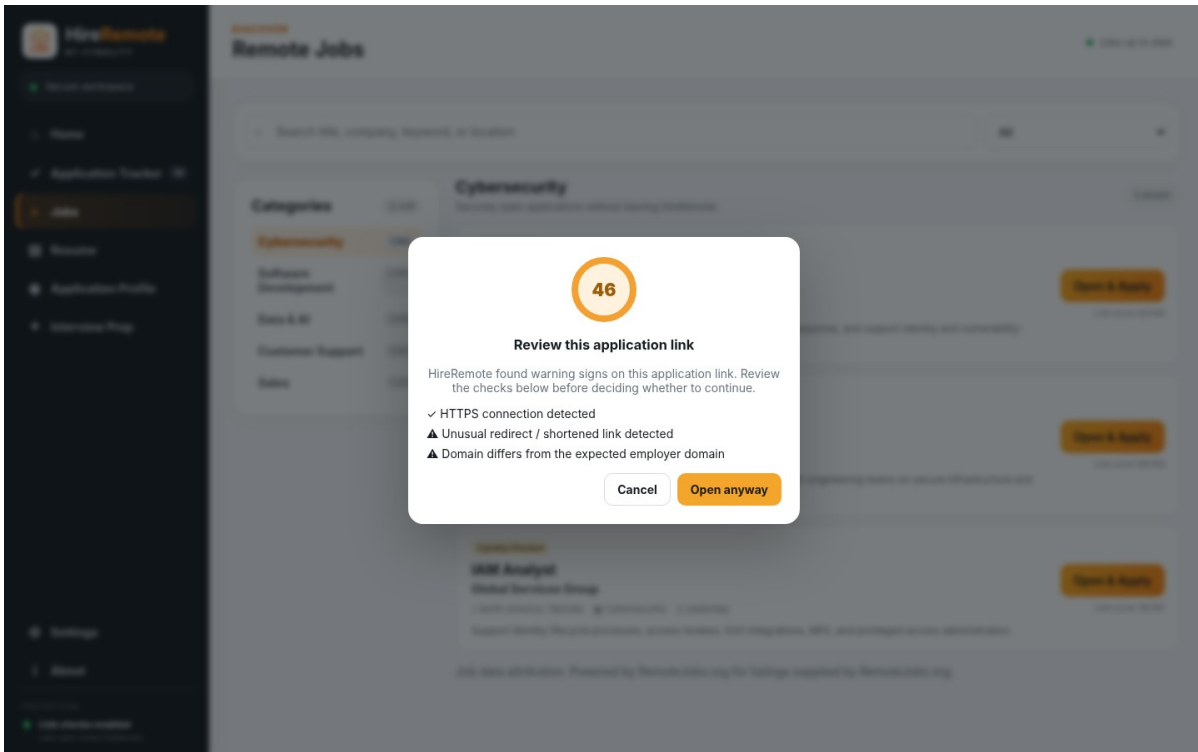


Figure 11. Example link-review warning before opening a higher-risk destination.

What the automated check considers

- HTTPS usage.
- URL structure and unusual formatting.
- Known source context.
- Link-shortener use.
- Punycode / look-alike-domain indicators.
- Other basic warning signs identified by the SecurityService.

If HireRemote asks you to review a link

- 1 Read the score, summary, and individual checks.
- 2 If the link looks unexpected, choose Cancel and independently locate the employer's official careers page.
- 3 If you understand the warning and still want to proceed, choose Open anyway.
- 4 Never interpret Cybality Checked as permission to send money, gift cards, cryptocurrency, banking credentials, Social Security numbers, tax IDs, or other highly sensitive data to an unverified recruiter.

Security notice

Cybality Checked is an automated URL/source risk check. It is not a guarantee that a posting, employer, recruiter, or website is legitimate.

8. Open & Apply and the in-app application browser

Figure 12. Application browser with persistent HireRemote navigation and Assisted Auto Apply.

Employer and ATS pages open in a separate, isolated WebView2 browser to the right of the HireRemote side navigation. The destination URL is intentionally hidden from the toolbar, and Back/Forward buttons are not provided.

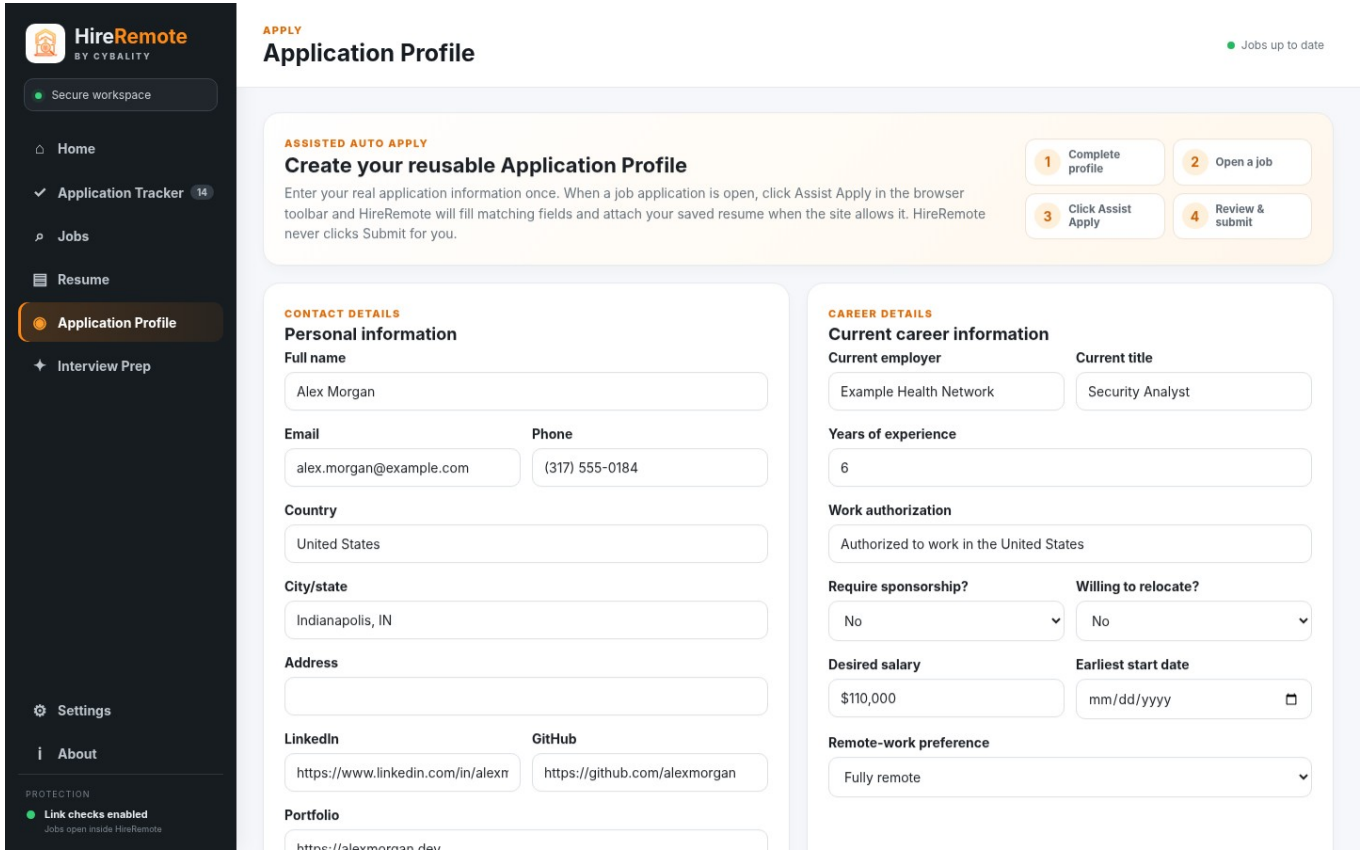
Application-browser controls

Assist Apply	Uses the saved Application Profile to fill compatible form fields and attempts to attach the saved resume. It does not submit the form.
Reload	Reloads the current employer/ATS page.
Close	Closes the external application browser and returns to the HireRemote page that was active.
Secure browser	Indicates the external site is running in the isolated application WebView rather than the trusted HireRemote UI WebView.

Isolation protections

- External employer/ATS pages do not receive the trusted HireRemote native message bridge.
- Camera, microphone, and geolocation permissions are denied by default in the external browser.
- Links that open during the application process remain within the external browser workflow when possible.
- The job/application URL is saved to Application Tracker so you can revisit the employer or ATS portal later.

Application Profile is the reusable factual profile used by Assisted Auto Apply and Resume Studio. Complete it with real information and review it periodically so automated form filling remains accurate.

Profile fields

- Resume and reusable cover-letter template.
- Full name, email, phone, country, city/state, and address.
- LinkedIn, GitHub, and portfolio URLs.
- Current employer and current title.
- Employment history, education, certifications, skills, and years of experience.
- Work authorization and whether sponsorship is required.
- Willingness to relocate, desired salary, earliest start date, and remote-work preference.
- Preferred job titles and preferred industries.

Save your profile

- 1 Complete the fields that you are comfortable using for job applications.
- 2 Add or replace the resume that HireRemote should use for Assisted Auto Apply.
- 3 Add a factual reusable cover-letter template if desired.
- 4 Click Save profile.
- 5 HireRemote encrypts the structured profile and the managed resume copy for the current Windows user using DPAPI.



9.1 Use Assisted Auto Apply

- 1 Open a job from Jobs or revisit one from Application Tracker.
- 2 Navigate to the employer's application form inside HireRemote.
- 3 Click Assist Apply in the top browser toolbar.
- 4 HireRemote inspects accessible form controls and fills fields it can confidently map to your saved profile.
- 5 If a recognizable resume/CV upload field is available, HireRemote attempts to attach the managed resume.
- 6 Review every page, every answer, and the attached resume yourself.
- 7 Complete any fields that HireRemote could not fill, then manually click the employer's Submit / Apply button when you are satisfied.

Assist Apply never submits for you

The v0.2.2 Assisted Auto Apply feature is intentionally user-controlled. It does not click Submit, Apply, or Send, and it does not accept legal terms or signatures for you.

Fields HireRemote intentionally avoids

- Social Security numbers, tax IDs, passwords, dates of birth, and other highly sensitive identity fields.
- Race, gender, disability, veteran status, religion, and similar demographic questions.
- CAPTCHAs, MFA, email verification, anti-bot challenges, and assessments.
- Background-check consent, legal attestations, signatures, or other statements that require the applicant's own decision.
- Any information not present in the saved profile or otherwise confidently mapped.

Partial autofill is normal

Some ATS systems use cross-origin iframes, custom controls, protected upload widgets, or anti-automation techniques. HireRemote may fill only part of an application. Complete the remaining fields manually.

10. Application Tracker

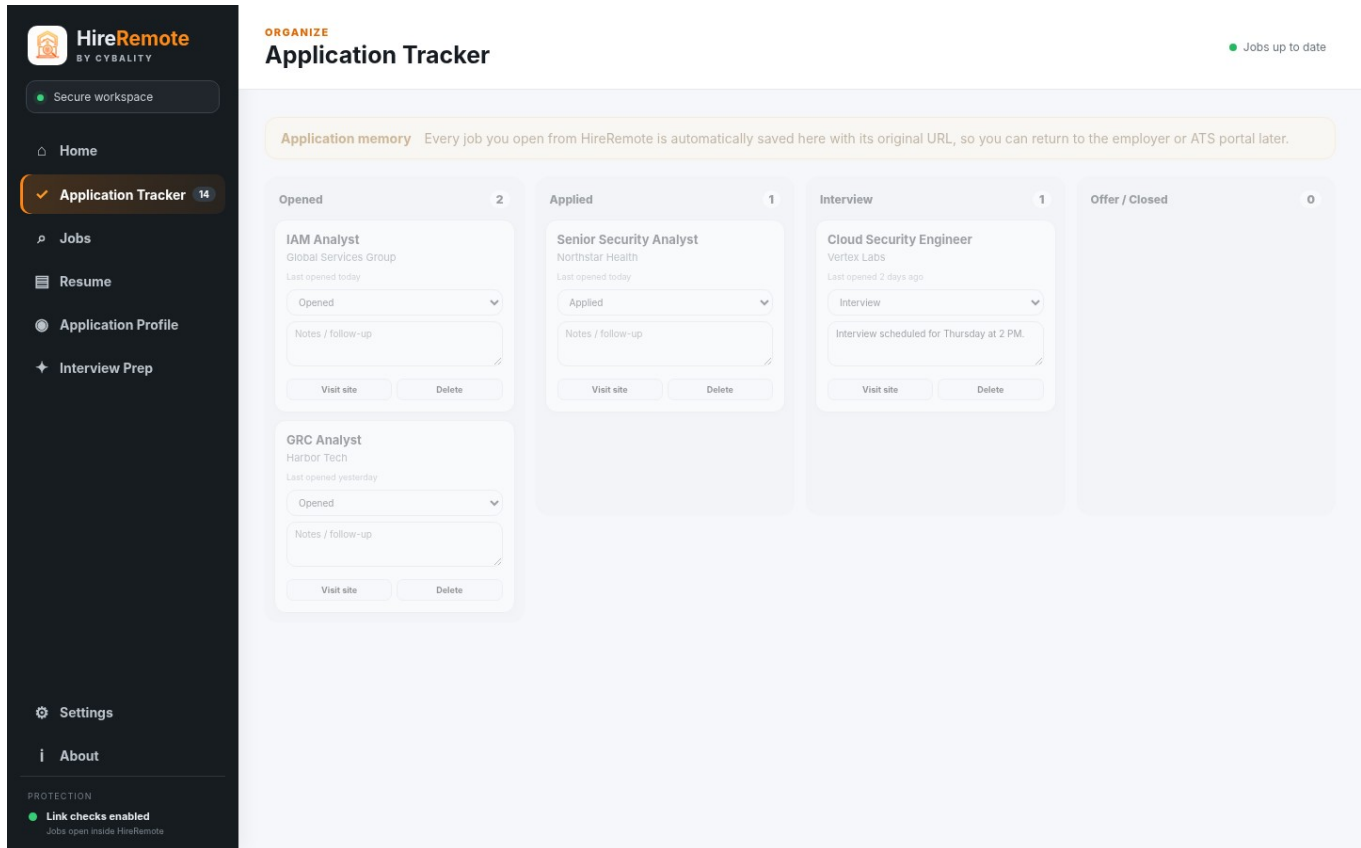


Figure 15. Application Tracker with workflow columns, notes, and revisit controls.

Every job opened from HireRemote is automatically recorded with its original application URL so the employer/ATS site can be revisited later. Tracker history is separate from the 90-day job-listing retention cycle.

Workflow

- Opened - a job/application has been opened from HireRemote.
- Applied - you have submitted the application.
- Interview - the process has advanced to an interview.
- Offer / Closed - includes later outcomes such as Offer, Rejected, or Withdrawn.

For each tracked application

- 1 Use the status drop-down to update progress.
- 2 Add notes such as recruiter names, interview dates, follow-up reminders, or application details.
- 3 Click Visit site to reopen the saved employer/ATS URL inside HireRemote.
- 4 Click Delete only when you no longer want the tracker record.

11. Resume Studio and Resume Analyzer

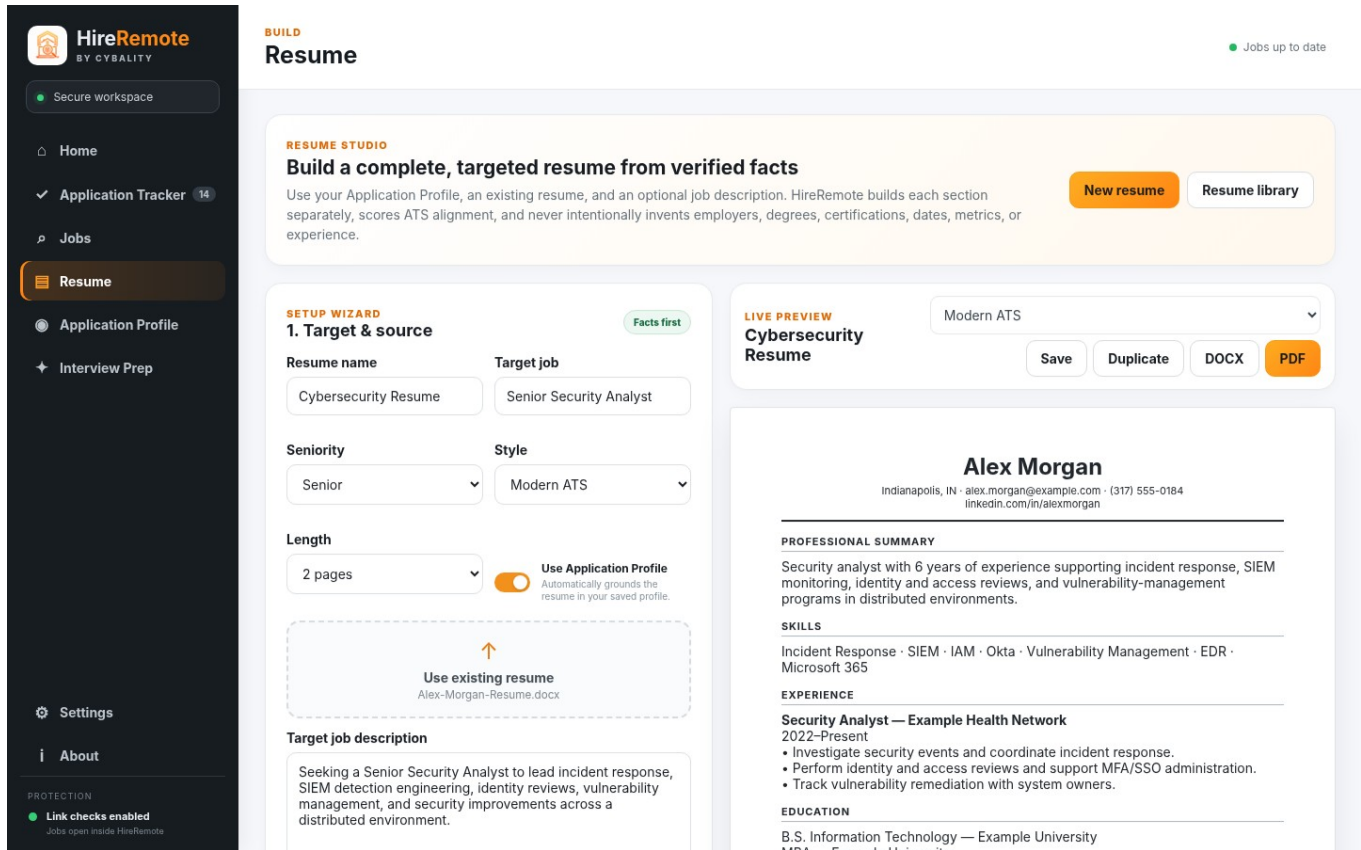


Figure 16. Resume Studio setup wizard, ATS score, and live preview.

Resume Studio in v0.2.2 is designed to create a usable targeted resume from verified facts rather than from one general free-form prompt. It combines Application Profile data, an optional existing resume, and an optional target job description.

11.1 Setup wizard

- 1 Enter a Resume name so you can identify this version later.
- 2 Enter the Target job, such as Senior Security Analyst.
- 3 Choose Seniority: Entry-level, Mid-level, Senior, Lead, Manager, or Director / Executive.
- 4 Choose an ATS-safe Style: Modern ATS, Classic ATS, or Compact ATS.
- 5 Choose a one-page or two-page target.
- 6 Leave Use Application Profile selected when you want the builder grounded in the factual profile you already saved.
- 7 Optionally choose an existing PDF, DOCX, TXT, MD, or RTF resume.

Paste a target job description or choose a recent HireRemote job and click Use selected job.

9

Click Build targeted resume.

11.2 Structured resume sections

HireRemote maintains separate fields for Contact Information, Professional Summary, Skills, Experience, Education, Certifications, and Projects. A matching Cover Letter is stored separately. This lets the app target and revise individual sections without treating the resume as one uncontrolled block of text.



11.3 Grounded generation and v0.2.2 reliability behavior

- HireRemote extracts the existing resume locally and preserves section boundaries where possible.
- Application Profile data and extracted resume text are treated as verified source facts.
- A local parser reconstructs Summary, Skills, Experience, Education, Certifications, and Projects before optional AI enhancement.
- If private AI is available, major sections are improved separately and then passed through a second constrained fact-audit request.
- If an AI section is empty, too short, or contains placeholders, HireRemote falls back to the verified local section instead of leaving an unfinished template.
- The builder is instructed not to invent employers, titles, dates, degrees, schools, certifications, skills, projects, years of experience, metrics, or accomplishments.

You still own the final accuracy check

The fact-audit pass reduces hallucination risk but cannot guarantee perfect factual accuracy. Review the live preview and every exported resume before applying.

11.4 ATS Match Score

- Matched keywords show terms present in both your verified resume/profile material and the target job description.
- Missing keywords show terms that may improve alignment only if they are actually true for you.
- The ATS Match Score is a comparison aid, not a guarantee that an employer's ATS will rank the resume in a particular way.

11.5 Achievement Bullet Generator

- 1 Paste a factual experience bullet, such as Managed security alerts and escalated incidents.
- 2 Click Improve bullet without inventing facts.
- 3 Review the rewritten result. If it introduces a claim or metric you did not provide, do not use that wording.

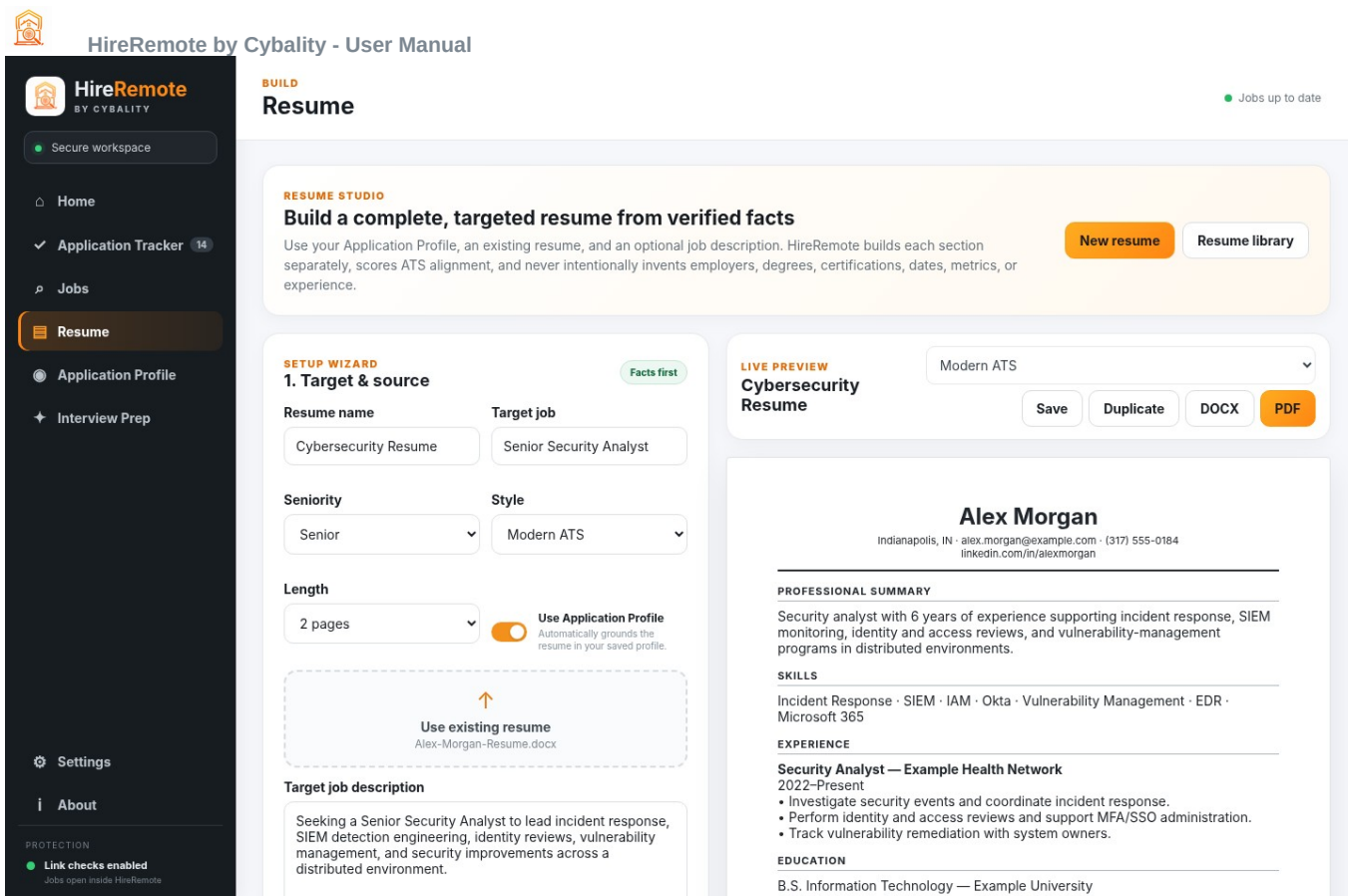


Figure 17. Resume Studio tools, analyzer, and lower-page controls.

11.6 Live preview and edit controls

- Edit resume content directly in the preview.
- Use Rewrite, Shorten, Strengthen, or Regenerate for editable sections/entries.
- Change the ATS-safe template from the preview toolbar.
- Use Save to store the current version in the encrypted local Resume Library.
- Use Duplicate to create a job-specific copy without overwriting the original.

11.7 Resume Library

Save multiple resume versions, such as Cybersecurity Resume, Security Manager Resume, or Cloud Security Resume. Duplicate a version before tailoring it to a different job so your master copy remains intact.

11.8 DOCX and PDF export

- 1 Review the live preview and factual accuracy.
- 2 Choose DOCX for an editable Microsoft Word document or PDF for a fixed-layout copy.
- 3 Select the destination folder when prompted.
- 4 Open the exported file and perform one final layout check before uploading it to an employer.



11.9 Matching cover letter

Enter the company name if desired and click Generate in the Cover Letter panel. HireRemote uses the same verified profile/resume facts and target job information. Review and edit the letter before using it.

11.10 Resume Analyzer

The Resume Analyzer accepts PDF, DOCX, TXT, MD, and RTF files. Baseline ATS-oriented scoring runs locally and can show strengths, top improvements, word count, and frequent keywords. Optional private AI feedback can add suggestions when the local AI helper is available.

Scanned/image-only PDFs

The resume extractor is text-based and does not include a general OCR engine. If a scanned PDF produces little usable text, use the original DOCX/TXT file or create a searchable PDF before analyzing or building from it.

12. Interview Prep

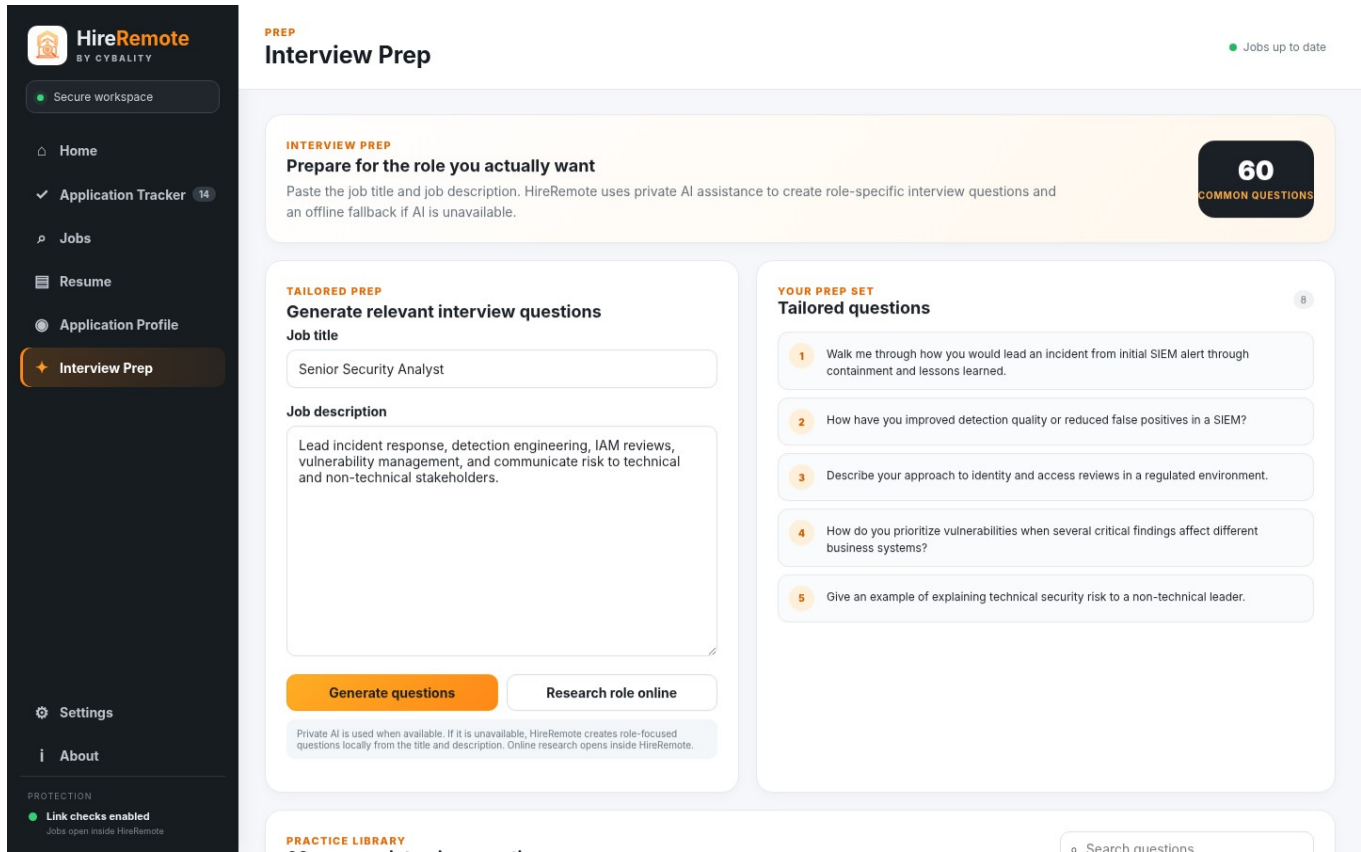


Figure 18. Tailored Interview Prep plus the built-in 60-question library.

12.1 Generate job-specific questions

- 1 Open Interview Prep.
- 2 Enter the Job title.
- 3 Paste the full Job description. More detail produces better role-specific prompts.
- 4 Click Generate questions.
- 5 Review the Tailored questions panel and practice answering them aloud using examples from your real experience.

12.2 Private AI and fallback

When private local AI assistance is available, HireRemote can use it to create a tailored practice set. If it is unavailable, HireRemote falls back to local job-title and job-description analysis so the feature can still produce role-focused questions.



12.3 Research role online

Click Research role online to create a targeted web search based on the job title and important terms from the description. The research page opens inside HireRemote's isolated browser.

12.4 60 common interview questions

The Practice Library contains 60 common questions spanning introductions, motivation, accomplishments, behavior, teamwork, problem solving, adaptability, leadership, communication, remote work, salary/start timing, and closing questions. Use Search questions to filter the library.

13. Settings and languages

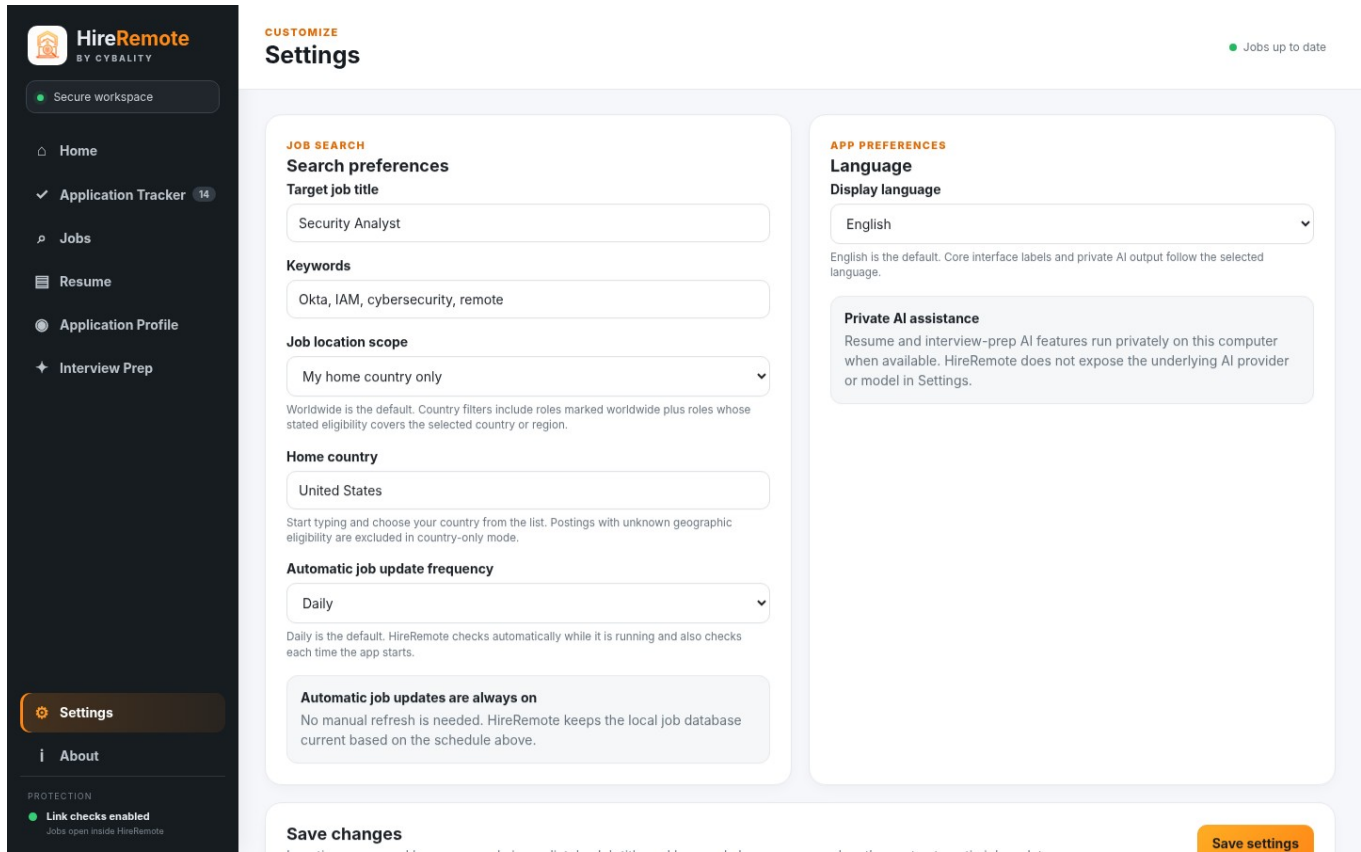


Figure 19. Job-search, location, update-frequency, and language settings.

13.1 Target job title and keywords

These settings influence the next automatic job update. Use a concise target title and a small set of meaningful keywords rather than a very long list.

13.2 Location scope

Worldwide	Default. Displays the worldwide database subject to normal search/category filters.
United States only	Shows listings whose stated eligibility supports the United States or worldwide eligibility.
My home country only	Enables the Home country type-ahead field and filters to worldwide listings plus jobs whose stated country/region eligibility covers the selected country.

13.3 Home-country selector

Choose My home country only, begin typing your country, and select the matching country from the populated list. Unknown-location postings are excluded in this mode rather than being treated as eligible.

13.4 Automatic job update frequency

- Hourly
- Every 6 hours



- Every 12 hours
- Daily - default

Automatic updates are always on; there is no manual refresh requirement. HireRemote checks the schedule while running and also checks at startup.

13.5 Display language

- English - default
- Spanish
- French
- German
- Italian
- Portuguese

Core interface labels and private AI output follow the selected language. The underlying AI provider/model is intentionally not exposed in Settings.

14. About, privacy, licensing, and security architecture

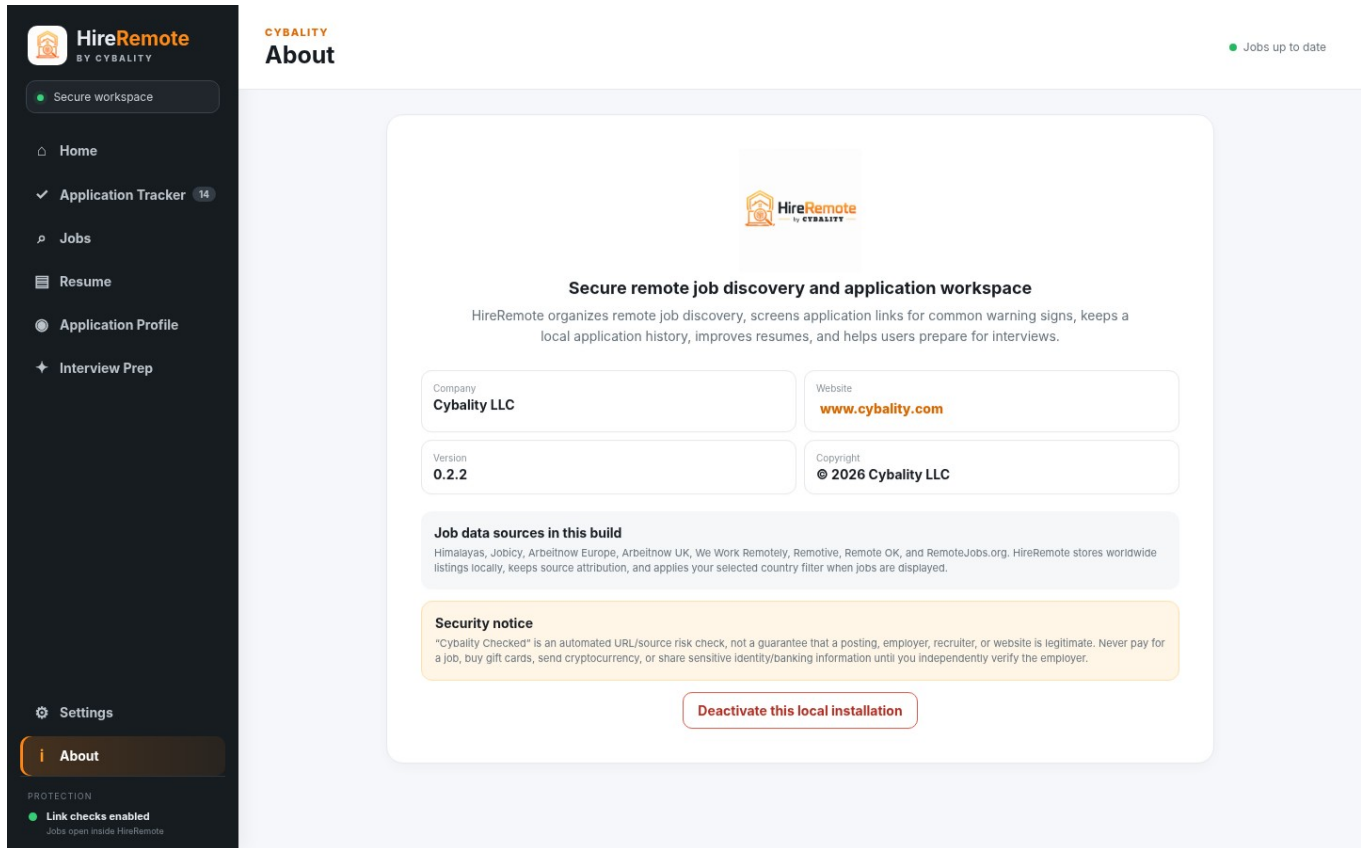


Figure 20. About page with company, version, job-source list, security notice, and deactivation control.

14.1 About page

- Company: Cybality LLC.
- Website: www.cybality.com.
- Version: 0.2.2.
- Copyright © 2026 Cybality LLC.
- Current source adapters are listed for transparency in the About page.
- Deactivate this local installation clears/deactivates the local membership activation state so the app can require a valid license again.

14.2 Local data and encryption

- Jobs, application-tracker metadata, settings, resume-analysis metadata, and other local records use a SQLite database under the current user's Local AppData profile.
- A validated Gumroad license key is protected with Windows DPAPI for the current user before being stored locally.
- Application Profile fields and the managed resume are protected with Windows DPAPI.
- Saved Resume Studio documents are stored as DPAPI-protected ciphertext in the local resume library.
- When a protected resume must be attached to an application or re-read by Resume Studio, HireRemote can materialize a short-lived temporary file and delete it after use.

14.3 Browser architecture

HireRemote uses two WebView2 controls: a trusted UI locked to the private app origin and a separate external browser for employer, ATS, search, and application websites. Only the trusted HireRemote origin can use the native



message bridge. External websites cannot directly call licensing, settings, job database, application-tracker, resume, interview-prep, or Application Profile APIs through that bridge.

14.4 Membership verification

The client verifies Gumroad membership using the configured product ID and customer-entered license key. No Gumroad creator/seller API token is embedded in the app. The official Buy or Renew page is fixed to the HireRemote Gumroad product page.



15. Troubleshooting

15.1 SmartScreen keeps blocking the installer

- 1 Confirm you have the intended HireRemote MSI from a trusted Cybality source.
- 2 If Windows provides More info, use the per-file Run anyway option only after confirming the file and source.
- 3 If no override is available, do not disable SmartScreen, Smart App Control, AppLocker, WDAC, or corporate endpoint security. On managed PCs, contact IT. For public distribution, a trusted code-signing solution is the long-term fix.

15.2 HireRemote opens to a blank window or fails to render

- Confirm Microsoft Edge WebView2 Runtime is installed and working.
- Restart Windows and launch HireRemote again.
- If the problem began after a WebView2/Windows update, repair or reinstall the WebView2 Runtime, then retry.
- If the app still fails, capture the Windows version, HireRemote version, and any visible error for Cybality support.

15.3 License key is rejected

- Make sure the key belongs to the HireRemote Gumroad product, not another Cybality product.
- Check Internet connectivity.
- Verify the membership is active and not refunded, disputed, charged back, failed, cancelled, or ended.
- Copy/paste the key carefully with no extra spaces.
- If Gumroad is temporarily unavailable but the key was recently verified on this computer, HireRemote can use its limited offline grace period.

15.4 No jobs appear after startup

- Allow the first automatic job update to finish.
- Open Settings and temporarily use Worldwide to determine whether a strict country filter is hiding results.
- Clear overly narrow title/keyword settings and wait for the next automatic update.
- Confirm the computer can reach the Internet.
- A provider can be temporarily unavailable; HireRemote can still display previously stored jobs.

15.5 A job link is blocked or shows a warning

Read the security summary. Cancel suspicious links and independently find the employer's official careers page. Use Open anyway only when you understand the warning and have independently established enough trust in the destination.



15.6 An application website does not work correctly inside HireRemote

- Click Reload once.
- Close the application browser and reopen the job from Jobs or Application Tracker.
- Some ATS sites use custom controls, cross-origin frames, or security restrictions that can limit embedded-browser behavior.
- If a site requires a feature HireRemote intentionally denies, such as camera or location, complete that employer-specific step using a method you trust and follow the employer's instructions.

15.7 Assist Apply fills only some fields

- Confirm Application Profile is saved and contains the needed factual information.
- Custom ATS widgets and cross-origin iframes may not expose standard form controls.
- Resume upload may fail on protected/custom file widgets; attach the resume manually if necessary.
- CAPTCHA, MFA, legal consent, signatures, assessments, demographic questions, and highly sensitive identity fields are intentionally not automated.

15.8 Resume Studio produces missing or weak sections

- Use a DOCX or searchable PDF when possible.
- Complete Application Profile before building the resume.
- Choose Use existing resume so the builder has verified source material.
- Paste a full target job description.
- If a section is weak, edit it directly or use Rewrite / Strengthen / Regenerate, then verify facts.
- v0.2.2 falls back to locally reconstructed verified sections if AI output is empty, too short, or contains placeholders.

15.9 PDF or DOCX export does not save

- Choose a folder where your Windows user has write permission, such as Documents or Desktop.
- Avoid exporting directly to a protected Program Files location.
- Close an older copy of the same DOCX/PDF if another program has it locked.
- Try a shorter filename if the path is unusually long.

15.10 Language did not change everywhere

Save the selected language in Settings and navigate to another section. Core interface labels and private AI output are localized, but content supplied by employers, job providers, or external web pages remains in the language supplied by those external sources.

16. Upgrade, uninstall, and quick reference

16.1 Upgrade to a newer HireRemote MSI

- 1 Close HireRemote.
- 2 Obtain the newer MSI from a trusted Cybality source.
- 3 Run the new MSI. The WiX installer is authored as a Major Upgrade, so a newer version is intended to replace the older installed version.
- 4 Launch HireRemote and confirm the new version under About.
- 5 Because user data is stored separately under the current user profile, normal application upgrades are designed around retaining local working data rather than treating every update as a brand-new profile.

16.2 Uninstall

- 1 Open Windows Settings.
- 2 Go to Apps > Installed apps.
- 3 Find HireRemote by Cybality.
- 4 Choose Uninstall and follow the Windows prompts.

The free-trial entitlement is not reset by a normal reinstall

HireRemote intentionally stores local trial state outside the main application database as well as under the current Windows user profile. Uninstalling and reinstalling the app does not create another one-time 10-minute preview.

16.4 Safer job-search habits

- Independently verify an employer before providing sensitive personal information.
- Do not pay a recruiter or employer to receive a job.
- Do not buy gift cards or send cryptocurrency as part of a hiring process.
- Be cautious when a recruiter moves communication to unusual channels or pressures you to act quickly.
- Compare the application domain with the employer's official website.
- Review every Assisted Auto Apply field before submitting.



References and version basis

This manual is based on the supplied HireRemote by Cybality v0.2.2 Windows source/build package, including its README, release notes, installer authoring, and product documentation for Security, Job Sources, Gumroad Licensing, Free Trial, Assisted Auto Apply, Architecture, and Resume Studio.
